Sponsors and Mentors

Club Sponsors and Mentors help a Newly Chartered Toastmasters club succeed.

They are involved in the creation of the club and are there to provide support and guidance for the first 6 months of the club's existence.



Sponsors vs Mentors

A Club Sponsor is part of club creation and remains for the first few months of the club's existence. They will help recruit new members, build and maintain enthusiasm, and fill out all the necessary paperwork.

A Club Mentor is with the club from the Charter date through the first six months of the club's existence. They will offer support, answer questions, lend insight, help the new club find its personality, and provide the club the knowledge and resources to continue to be a successful, thriving club once the first six months have passed.

The Club mentor also ensures the New Club Officers are fully trained and know how to perform their roles.

- Understand their role and responsibilities

Sponsor Responsibilities

- ➤ Identify the potential club.
- > Build enthusiasm
- ➤ Help ensure all paperwork is filled out correctly and submitted. (Including payments)
- > Assist the Club Mentors for the first few meetings



Mentor Responsibilities

- Offer guidance
- Answer Toastmasters related questions
- Provide effective feedback
- Provide New Club Officer training
- ▶ Help club develop continuing membership campaigns
- ► Define and show importance of the Distinguished Club Program
 - Lead by example!



Closing the Deal

As a Club Sponsor and Mentor, you are integral to the future success and longevity of the club.

When you are communicating with the club or in attendance, you represent District 5 and Toastmasters. Remember that!

Extra work is required. Being assigned as the Club Sponsor or Mentor is not enough to get credit. When your role in the club has completed, the club will receive the paperwork to give you credit. If you did not earn or deserve it, credit does not have to be given.
