All contestants must complete this form before the contest and submit it to the chief judge at each level of competition.



1000 TOASTMASTERS

Eligibility (To be completed for all contests)

Loerdly that Lam eligible to compete, under the careert speech context rules, Lam a paid member of a club is good standing and meet all other slightly squitements.

To be eligible to compete in any afficial Toyotmatters speech context, a member must be a paid member of a club in the area, division, and district in which he or she is competing. The club must also be in good standing. In addition, to be eligible to compete in the international Speech Context, a member must have completed. at least us speech projects in the Computery Communication manual or earned certificates of completion in Levels 1 and 2 of any path in the Toastmasters Pathways learning experience prior to the club contest. Contestants in speech contests other than the International contest do not need to meet this requirement.

The following are ineligible to compete in any Toatmatien speech contest:

a) A member serving as a voting sudge or liebraiking sudge beyond the club level far a contest type in which the member is still competing or intends to competer til incumbent international officers and direction.

In Presenters of education sessions, correct chain, context Toatmasters, chief judges and event committee chain for the event at which the contest will be held. including area, division, and district events, as well as the International Convention

Contest chains, chief autges, voting judges, tebraiking judges, times, countens, sequents at arm and test speakers may not compete in the contest at which they are serving.

Tostmusten who are metaben in more than one club and who meet all other eligibility requirements are permitted to compete in each club context in which paid membership is held. No contestant can compete in more than one arm speech contest of a given type, even if the two arms are in different divisions or districts.

Connectants must maintain eligibility at all levels of any concest. If at any level it is determined that a contestant was ineligible to comprise at any previous level. the contestant must be disputitient. This disputitication must occur even if the ineligibility is discovered at a titre level and has been contected.
