Toastmasters Hybrid Speech Contest

Special Considerations

On top of all the guidance for "online speech contests best practices" and in- person contest guidance, a hybrid contest can have several unique challenges.

In District 5 "hybrid" means the Contestants, judges, ballot counters, or timers can be online or in person. For the purposes of brevity, I will give thoughts when only the Contestants and Judges are both online and in person. I would imagine that it can be arranged that the Timers and Ballot Counters can be required to be in a location most suitable for the Contest.

Contestants:

- 1. The Contestants in person will have more presentation space than the contestants online.
- 2. An in-person Contestant will need to be presenting into a camera with audio pickup so the online judge can see and hear the presentation.
- 3. Queuing the Contestants: Follow the related rules for the online or in-person introductions as appropriate. The Toastmaster will need to be mindful of the proper queuing words based on which Contestant is being introduced.
- 4. The speaking order would be best done prior to the day of the Contest.

Timer:

- 1. Signaling information needs to be fed in-person and online.
- 2. This could be done with as few as two Timers. The Timer with the signaling device could be online with a laptop as well as in the room with the Timer with the stopwatch.
- 3. The Timer with the signaling device would run both devices: for the speaker in person, one device; and for the speaker online the other device.

Judges:

- 1. The challenge here is an in-person judge hearing an online Contestant.
- 2. There must be room level audio for the in-person judge to hear the online Contestant.
- 3. As noted in the "Contestant" section, the in-person Contestants need to be speaking into a camera/audio device so the online judges and see and hear the Contestant.

A solution.

- 1. A room with wifi.
- 2. An internet capable camera: cell phone or laptop.
- 3. A blue tooth speaker linked to the camera option.
- 4. Seating alignment such that the online and in-person judges both have a clear view of the Contestant.
- 5. Large screen TV to project Zoom so the in-person judges have a clear view of the online Contestants.
