



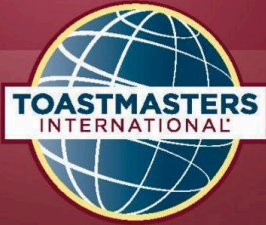

3. Members other than delegates may speak to a question by permission of the assembly.



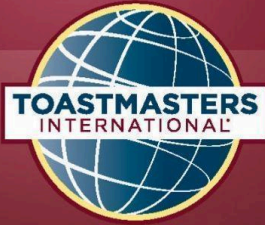

District 5 Mid-Year Audit Report

April 17, 2026

Mid-year Audit Committee Report

The 2025-2026 District 5 Audit Committee composed of Joyce Persichilli, DTM, PRA, Karen Crabtree, DTM and Hugh Rothman, PM4.

We are in the process of completing the review of the financial records for the first six months of the 2025-2026 District 5 Toastmaster Year. It is a Toastmaster International requirement that the Audit Committee Fiduciary duties include measuring the district's financial health, and ensuring the Mid-year Audit Reports accurately reflect the district's income and expenses.

The intent of this report is to provide additional information not contained in the District 5 Mid-year Audit Report that is being prepared, reviewed, signed, and submitted to Toastmasters International. As part of a successful audit, recommendations are made to help the district improve its financial management and to lay the groundwork for future audits. It is in this spirit that this Audit Committee makes recommendations that ensure compliance with the requirements of District Audits established by Toastmasters International.

1) Debit Card Management and Accounting

Improvements are needed in the management and accounting of debit card transactions.

Of the months reviewed (July through December), a few of the months raised specific concerns:

- A. One personal transaction was identified. This charge must be reimbursed to the district.
- B. Several charges did not include supporting documentation.
- C. It was brought to the Committee's attention that revenue from certain events may not have been submitted to the Finance Manager for deposit into the district's local bank account. Clarification is needed to determine whether this occurred.

Recommendations

- Greater care must be taken to ensure timely submission of debit card receipts, including clear documentation detailing the purpose of each expense. This will strengthen oversight of District 5 funds and improve the accuracy and reliability of financial reporting.
- If required documentation is not provided to the Finance Manager in a timely manner, access to the district debit card should be suspended until the matter is resolved.
- Any outstanding questions regarding revenue not submitted to the Finance Manager should be reviewed and resolved within the next 30 days.



District 5 Mid-Year Audit Report (CONTINUED)

Summary

Overall, the Audit Committee finds that the district's financial records adequately represent the financial position of District 5. The Committee encourages District leadership to implement the recommendations outlined in this report to strengthen internal controls and financial management practices.

This concludes the Mid-Year Audit Committee Report.

Current Performance & DCP Benchmarks

District 5 is working toward its first "Distinguished District" status since 2015. The current breakdown of our 101 clubs relative to Distinguished Club Program (DCP) goals is as follows:

- **Status Tiers:**
 - **Distinguished:** 47 Clubs with 5+ goals (Current: 33 clubs have met this).
 - **Select Distinguished:** 52 Clubs with 5+ goals.
 - **President's Distinguished:** 58 Clubs with 5+ goals.
- **The "Gap" Analysis:**
 - 14 Clubs are only 1 goal away from reaching Distinguished status.
 - 11 Clubs currently require membership growth assistance to qualify for DCP recognition.

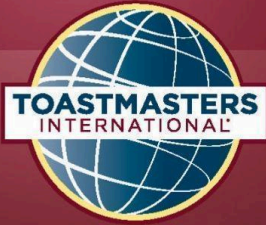

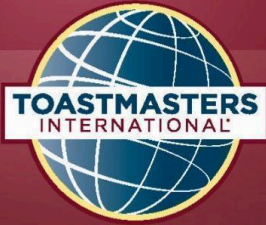

While the numbers show improvement from last year, we are for the time being short of our target. Let's continue encouraging clubs to remind their members to renew if they haven't done so already.



Many clubs have made significant progress toward becoming Distinguished by completing additional DCP goals before April 3rd. Here are the numbers:

As of February the 28th there were: 29 clubs with 5+ DCP goals accomplished, 10 clubs with 4 DCP goals accomplished, and 13 clubs with 3 DCP goals accomplished.

As of April the 2nd there were: 33 clubs with 5+ DCP goals accomplished, 14 clubs with 4 DCP goals accomplished, and 11 clubs with 3 DCP goals accomplished.

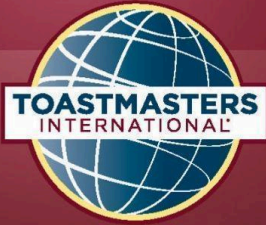
Our goal for our community this Toastmasters year 2025-2026 is:

Keep the main thing the main thing: As leaders, we are here to help and support members accomplish their goals on their journey of growth through Toastmasters. We know how well we are doing by looking at two metrics: A club's membership growth and a club's DCP goals achievements. When members are well supported, they use the educational program and they accomplish project levels. As a result, they accomplish DCPs for their club. If members are growing and enjoying their TM journey, it becomes attractive and infectious to other members to do the same. More guests show up and more guests end up becoming members. As a result, a club adds new members and grow in size.



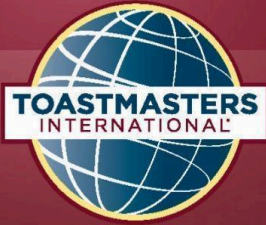
